

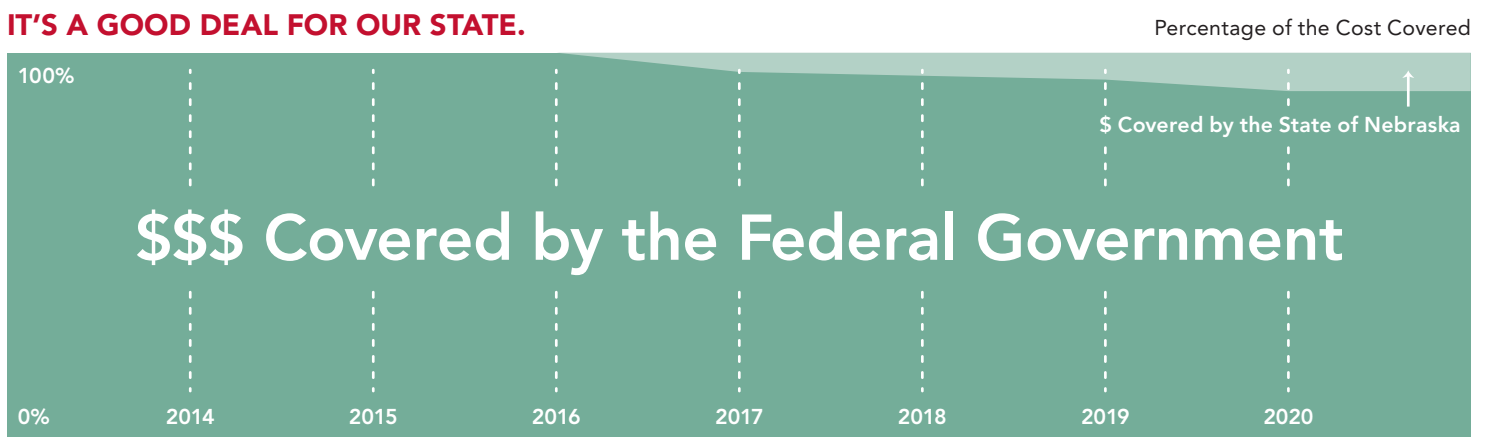

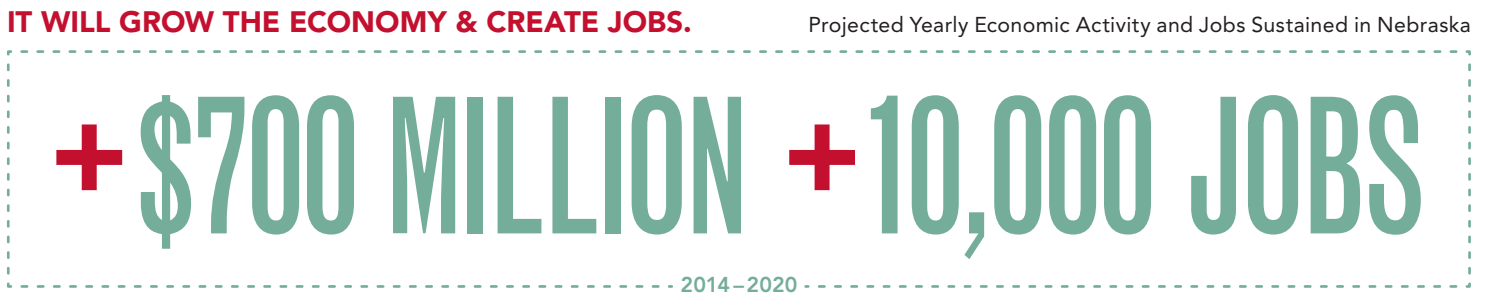
The new Medicaid program for low-income, working Nebraskans under the Affordable Care Act.

A strong economy, job creation, vibrant communities, and healthy children all depend on a health care system that works. Nebraska has a great opportunity under the Affordable Care Act to improve its health care system and provide health care access for the 225,000 uninsured Nebraskans. The ACA creates a new program that will provide Medicaid coverage to persons under the age of 65 who have incomes below 138% of poverty (\$15,415 for a single person and \$26,344 per year for a family of 3). The program is 100% federally funded from 2014 through 2016 and then 90% federally funded by 2020 and going forward.
