
Nebraska Appleseed Law Clerk Job Description:

Nebraska Appleseed clerkships are full or part time positions and provide opportunities to experience a wide variety of public interest law. Law clerks will do research, legal writing, litigation support, assist with administrative appeals and advocacy and conduct public policy research and analysis. Law clerks work directly under the supervision of Nebraska Appleseed Staff Attorneys allowing them to get one on one attention and direction.

Law clerks are assigned projects from several of Nebraska Appleseed's six program areas:

1. **Low-Income Self-Sufficiency Program**, which seeks laws and policies that move families from poverty to economic security;
2. **Child Welfare System Accountability Program**, which works to improve Nebraska's child welfare system to better serve children;
3. **Immigrant Integration and Civic Participation Program**, which seeks policies and practices that welcome new immigrants into Nebraska communities and encourages them to participate in public processes at the city, county, state, and federal level;
4. **Health Care Access Program**, which seeks laws and policies that ensure all Nebraskans have access to quality, affordable health care;
5. **Building Democracy Program**, which looks to promote access to the democratic process for low-income Nebraskans; and
6. **Access to Justice Program**, which helps promote access to the civil legal system for low-income Nebraskans.
